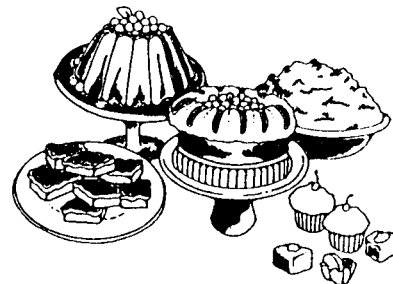
from the Pastor's Desk

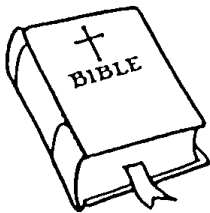
